NAME OF PROPERTY

Morning Star Mine -

Samuel A. and Samuel V. Walsh - leasers.

LOCATION OF PROPERTY

Kinsley Mining District, White Pine County, Nevada, 6 miles highway and 16 miles unimproved dirt road, easterly from Boone Springs (Highway 60) Nevada.

GEOLOGY

Small, irregular contact metamorphic ore bodies occurring between limestone (Cambrian Age ?) and monzonite dikes (Cretaceous Age?). Limestone strikes generally N. 70° W. and dips 45-55° North. Dikes of variable thickness have a general northeasterly strike. Economic metals are silver, copper, and lead with small amount of zinc.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY

Property consists of 5 lode claims. Principal mine workings on the property consist of an old inclined shaft - badly gouged out, and three short levels with a few small pillars of ore remaining in the mine. These workings are centrally located on the Morning Star claim. All work was done in a desultory manner.

PRESENT AND POTENTIAL ORE RESERVES

Liberal estimate of possibly 500 tons of \$16.00 ore. Potential reserves none.

ANYTHING ELSE RELATED TO THE PROPERTY ITSELF

No development work, of recent times, had been done on property by leasers.

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
