have not been active recently. Some geochem and staking in periphery.

GEOLOGY: A string of shafts and adits are along a vein system that strikes almost E.W.,  
Photo#23. Either the miners worked the strike of the veins to the surface or they collapsed  
and were later dozed. Further to the east the vein system can be seen to be a part of a fault  
that has been followed by a series of drifts and adits. The vein maybe 50 Ft. wide in some  
places. The country rock is limestone (Poleta?) which has been highly fractured by granite  
dikes. Quartz is everywhere as veins and veinlets and has altered the limestone along the  
contact to a light brown partly brecciated skarn. Sample #1122 was selected at random along  
the full length of the collapsed structure.
