DEVELOPMENT: One major incline and sever smaller ones and open stopes and prospects.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: One major incline and several lessor workings flooded to the surface follow a N 30°W, 65°SW fault vein in a lithic rich, strongly welded rhyolite tuff. The vein is about 4 feet wide and can be traced on the surface along the strike for several hundred feet. The size of the large dump suggest several hundred feet of under-ground workings. Also a small mill down the hill 150 feet SW of main shaft. Wrecked cars in the vicinity are from the early 1920's. Sample 2798 was selected from the dump near the large shaft and consist of quartz vein material bleached gouge, some micro-breccia with pyrite, copper oxides tetrahedrite, and possible gold. Mill included grinding facilities and leach vats.
