DEVELOPMENT: One new and one old shaft.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: The two shafts are very near the contact between the Tertiary rhyolite flows and the limestones of Ordovician age. The older shaft was sunk on a vuggy 2-4 foot wide quartz vein that bears E-W and dips 85°N. A later shaft about 1930's (?) was sunk about 70 feet to the west on the same vein. The head frame and hoist house are still in place above the second shaft. The size of the associated dumps suggest 3-5 hundred feet of underground workings. Sample 2043 was selected from the dumps and the exposed quartz vein. The material is a vuggy, iron-stained quartz with no viable mineralization. The local drainage abounds in jasperoid which may account for the number of roads and drill pads built during the last few years.
