DEVELOPMENT: About 1500 feet of workings off the sides of a glory-hole.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None but area has been drilled since the 1950's.

GEOLOGY: The glory-hole and prospects are in a schist of Ordovician age that is near the contact with granite of Cretaceous age. The glory-hole is circular in shape and about 100 feet across at the top in can be driven into from the west. Sample 2069 was selected from narrow silicified shears with the pit. Assays were low in base metals..the mine is said to have produced native gold from the silicified stringers.
