SUBJECT: MONTEZUMA CLAIMS - PH

On January 7 the area was examined in general, and the claim areas as specifically as possible (no posts were located during either inspection). The reconnaissance did not disclose any activity in the immediate area; neither did it discover anything of interest on the claims which we control.

The area of the Rambler and Horse disconnected claims (Survey No 3429) contains a granitic body, intrusive into limestones and shales. Local small iron additions have been introduced into the limestones, presumably from the intrusive. No other mineralization is visible.

In the area of the Washington #2, White Rock, Gray Eagle #1 & 2 there are small quartz veins from which previous assays returned trace Au

and about one ounce Ag/ton. The quartz is ~~is~~ enclosed within limestones and shales.

At this time these claims are of no further interest to us.

Would it not be to our advantage to use these claims as bargaining power in renegotiation of the lease?

There may be a flurry of activity soon in the Tongah-Divide area which is about 20 miles distant from the Montezuma region.

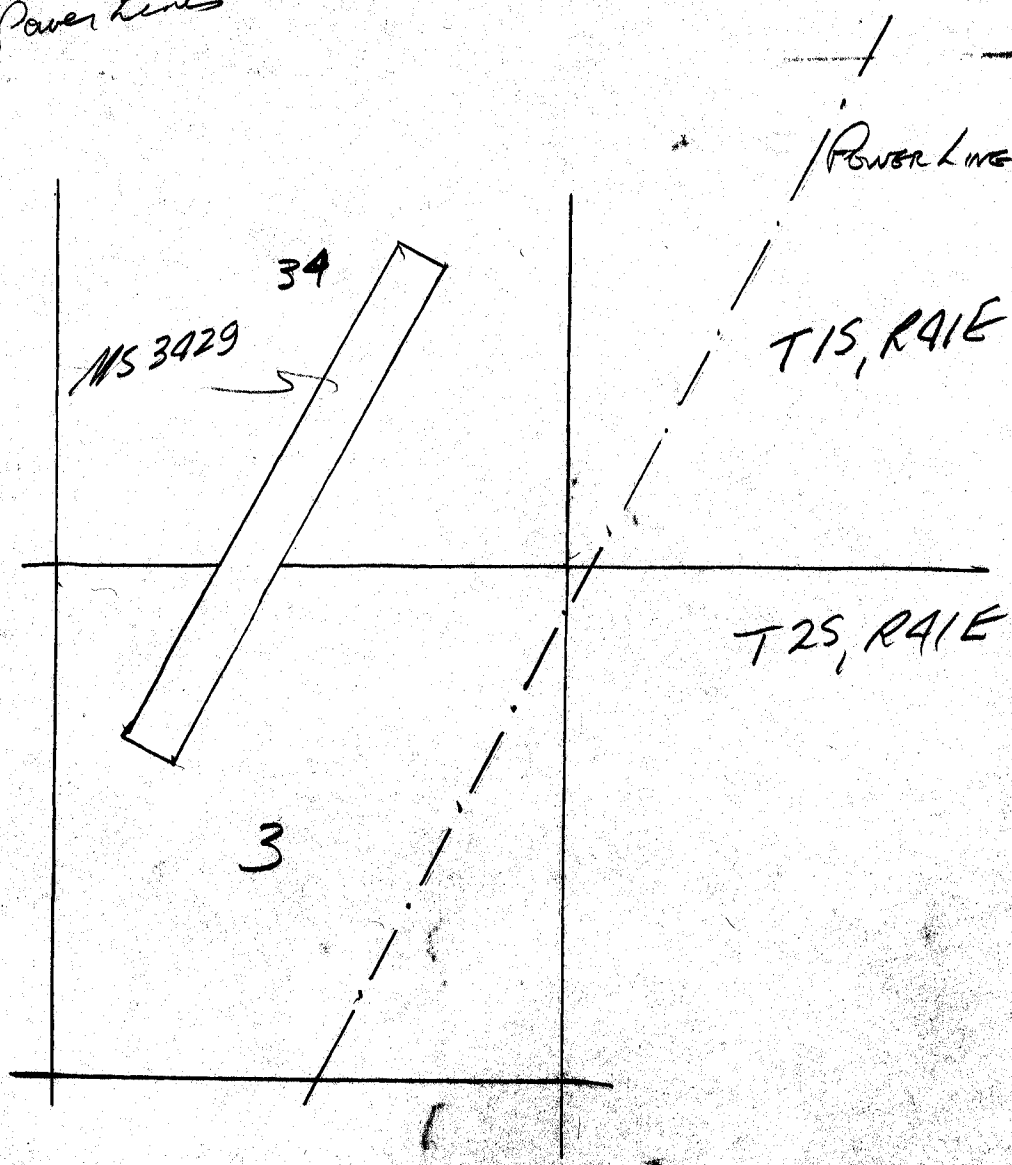

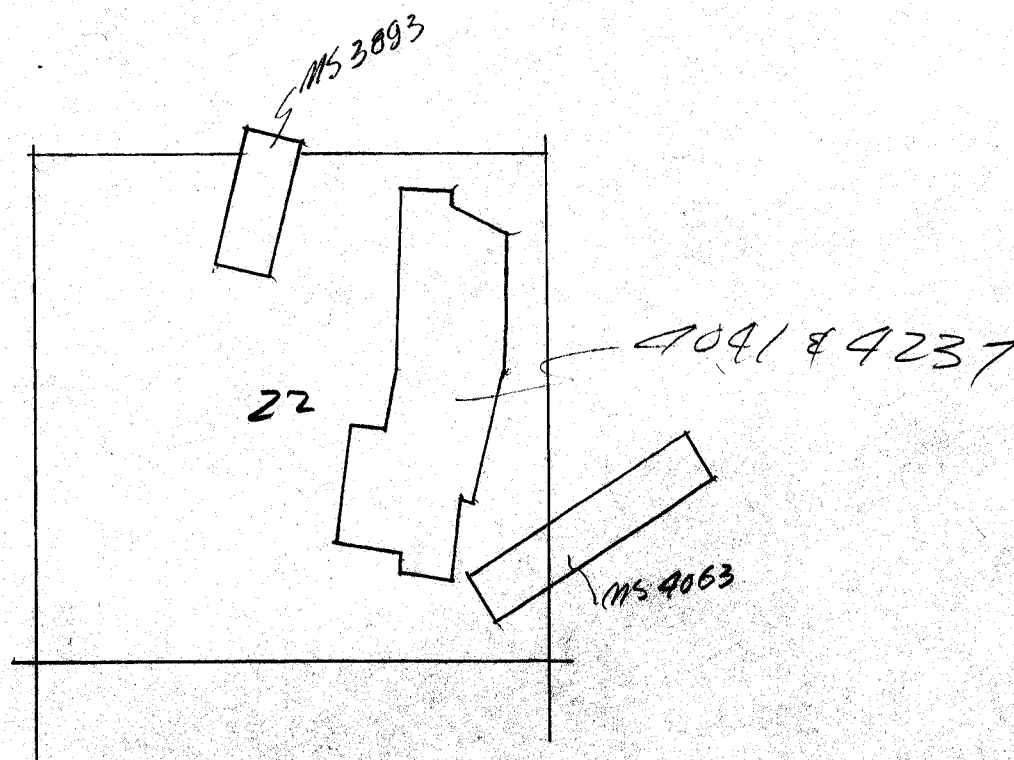
