

FAIR WEATHER DISTRICT.

Mines were discovered in this district in April of 1870. The district was organized at once, joining Cope on the northeast. The veins are said to be well defined on the surface, and from two to six feet in width. But little work has been done.

MURREY DISTRICT.

This district is in the northwest corner of the county, and was organized in July, 1869. Cope joins it on the southeast. The Eclipse, Wool, Kansas, Black Eagle, Raven, Grey Eagle, St. George, St. Andrews and Lodi, are among the prominent claims. They are from three to fifteen feet in width on the surface. A tunnel runs eighty-five feet on the Wool, to the vein which is seven feet in width. The ore yields, selected, \$113 per ton. It carries but little base metal. The Eclipse is opened by a shaft to the depth of six feet, and shows good ore. So little work is done, that no correct description of the mines can be given.
