LOCATION OF PROPERTY

New Pass Mining District, Lander County, Nevada, 25 miles from Ledley, Nevada.

GEOLOGY

Three intersecting veins, two of which, the Gold Belt and Superior, are of some importance. The Superior vein occurs in diorite which shows intense fracturing and shearing and the development of considerable schistocity adjacent to the vein. The Gold Belt vein is on a contact with limestone and diorite. Values occur principally as gold and silver.

DEVELOPMENT

The Superior vein is developed by three adit tunnels. Tunnel No. 1 has been driven 700 feet on the vein, No. 2 has been advanced 1145 feet on the vein, and No. 3 about 1000 feet. Several raises connect these levels and considerable stoping has been done over widths of from 3 to 8 feet. The Gold Belt vein is developed by a single compartment shaft 350 feet deep, from which 5 levels have been turned. Accessible ore exposures sampled about 0.35 oz. gold but measured ore reserves are very small.
