"Twenty six mining distrriicts are distributed irregularly over the county, ~~xmex~~ ... and though silver is the principal valuable metal in all, each has its specific claim for consideration....Cave, Bald Mountain and White Pine are in the White Pine range. The two formerr are but little known and are uninhabited. (p. 192).

"In Patterson district a quartz ledge 6 feet thick, of rich chloride, was found. The ledge dips at an angle of 30° and has a hanging wall of clay shale. Another ledge 75 feet distant dipping towards the first one has been found, and may prove to be an off-shoot from the main body. Only prospecting near the surface has been done on the Patterson mine. Samples of ore assayed at \$94 and some of it as high as \$1,200 and \$1,500 per ton ". (p. 560).
