The U.P.R.R., a country road and a stream of water goes by the property. The electric power line serving the ranches in the area is about 1 mile away.

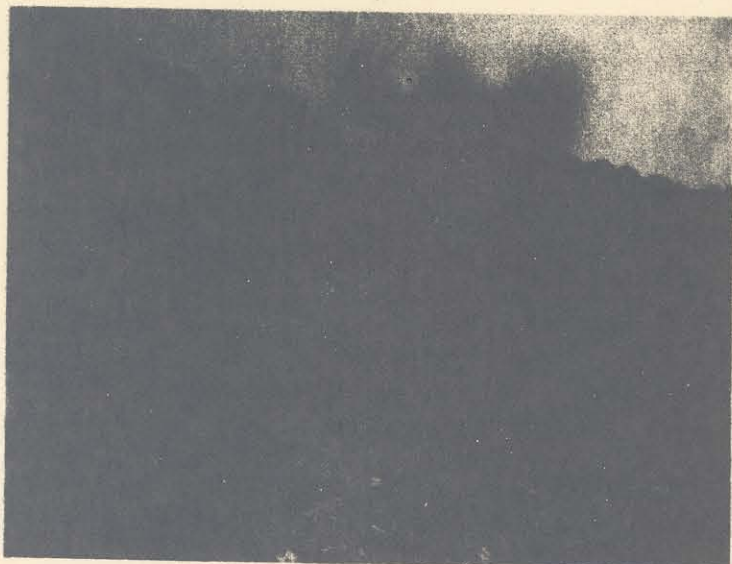

SUBJECT: Trip to Caliente, Meadow Valley Wash Area

Report: June 27th: Mr. Stephenson called and asked that I contact Mr. Bradshaw and meet him in Caliente to go over the Bradshaw property.

June 28th: With Mr. Stephenson and Mr. Bradshaw. The Bradshaw property was inspected by Mr. Stephenson. Mr. Stephenson was not favorably impressed with the property.

As a courtesy, Mr. Bradshaw showed us the Johnson property in the Pennsylvania District about 25 miles Southeast of Caliente. Mr. Stephenson inspected the same. It is a rough country and rough road. Returned to Caliente about 5:30 pm and thence to Tonopah.
