GEOLOGY: Mine on north side of the St. Anthony stock; sedimentary bedding strikes about N40°W, dips 30° to north away from stock contact. Wall rock mainly hornfels, thin (1"-6") lenses of weakly silicated limestone in hornfels section. The upper (southern) workings may be in pendants of sediments within the granodiorite. The sediments seem to fold around the northeast end of the granodiorite mass. Sample 2653 consists of weak garnet skarn with visible scheelite.
