Railroad district.—Seventeen producers reported the production of 3,324 tons of ore, containing \$249 in gold, 39,252 ounces of silver, 595.931 pounds of copper, and 165.078 pounds of lead, valued in all at \$209,478, or an average value per ton of \$63.02. All this ore was of shipping grade and was produced largely by lessees operating the Gray Eagle property. There were also important shipments from the Bunker Hill, Kentucky, Ennor, Hale & Peterson, Sweepstake, Sylvania, Bald Mountain Chief, and Copper Bell mines.
