

NEVADA
HUMBOLDT COUNTY

RED BUTTE DISTRICT

On west slope of Jackson Mountains, 25 miles by road from Jungo, with last 12 miles impassable in 1937. First prospected in 1907. Exploration work confined to copper. To 1937 total production has been three carloads of copper lead ore and one carload of lead-zinc-silver ore, and about 20 tons of antimony ore.

Prevailing rock is GABBRO cut by dikes of aplite. Copper comes with Aplite dikes. Copper minerals are generally oxidized and associated with iron oxides and a little barite. in 1937 the "DEPOSITS HAVE NEVER BEEN DEVELOPED BEYOND THE PROSPECT STAGE".

Several miles southeast are two unpatented antimony claims. Sb occurs in a quartz vein as oxides on surface and stibnite at depth, in andesite and diorite.

Sept. 22, 1930 : "May be Tin at Pilgrim Mine Property"

Pilgrim Mine in Jackson Range, near Jungo. It was believed that tin ore had been uncovered on the Hanging wall in a pocket. Samples had been sent for assay to the University of Nevada. W. Anderson was owner of property and William Laudelt and B.H. Adams were leasers.

No other comments followed this up.
