DEVELOPMENT: One very deep shaft and hoist-house and other buildings, good road to mine.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None lots of No Trespassing signs.

GEOLOGY: The mine is in the Miocene Volcanics south of Red Mountain Photo's 18 and 19. A very limited sampling from the edge of the main dump was all that was possible. (Sample #1139). The mine is not in operation but the property is not really accessible. The Nivloc is one of the three large silver producers in the district all of which are located in the volcanics south of Red Mountain.

Another of the big producers is the 16-1 owned by The Sunshine Mining Co. of Idaho which was not accessible the day I was there. Photo #17 is the milling operation eight miles west of Silver Peak. The mill process ores from the companys 16-1 Mine which is between the Nivloc and the Mohawk Mine to the west.
