Pearl Harbor - Rio Mountain Dist. (184)

In 1942 schistite was found in a road cut 9.7 miles east of Dayton on U. S. Highway 60. Five hundred feet north of the highway a layer of tactite 3 feet wide and 100 feet long was found in a small pendant of hornfels in granite, and the ground was located as the Pearl Harbor claim. In 1943, the Pearl Harbor Syndicate (James E. Pollard and associates) shipped 241 tons of ore averaging 0.69 percent of WO₃ (216 units) to Metals Reserve Co. The deposit was opened through a 50-foot shaft with levels at 30 and 60 feet. A stopes extends from the 30 foot level to the surface. Granite

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appears to cut off the ore body between the 30-foot and 60-foot levels.
