T H E P A C K A R D G R O U P

The Packard Group is located about two miles south west from Nenzel Hill, Rochester, Humboldt County, Nevada. The discovery of rich ore at the surface was made about April 1913. At the present writing the property is held under a bonded lease - \$500 cash having been paid and the balance \$4500 due at the end of one year. The original owners collect 10% net from all ore shipped.

The gross value of all ore shipped to date - all taken from shallow surface cuts - is about \$22,000. (Statement by J.J.Moss) .

The development work to date is about as follows:

Open Cut - 200 to 300 feet long, 10 to 40 feet wide, and from 5 to 10 feet deep.

Prospect Shaft - 25' in depth along the slip in which the best ore occurred-see sample No.7. There is no ore showing at the bottom of this shaft.

Tunnel - Extends from 150 to 200 feet into the hill to ascertain if the surface ore goes down. This tunnel must be driven about 100 feet further to get under the surface open cut. There is no ore in sight here-although the foreman claims that the gouge along the fractures will pan free gold.

The country rock is Rhyolite - very much altered and leached. The vein matter is soft oxidized material - composed largely of iron oxide, blue quartz fragments, and - in places - considerable sericite.

Two samples were taken with results as follows:

Sample No.6. Grab from a pile of ore - about 2 tons - supposed to be of shipping grade. Assay: Gold: \$1.20; Silver: \$12.00; Total:\$13.20.

Sample No.7. Cut across the north face of the main open cut - about six feet below the surface - Claim shipping grade of ore - Width sample - 5 feet.

Assay: Gold:\$1.60; Silver:\$3.43; Total:\$5.03.
