GEOLOGY: Area has had two stages of activity, an earlier period, possibly in the 1930's, and the most recent, within the last couple of years. Workings consist of at least three shafts (death traps), one adit and several dog holes, and dozer cuts. Others workings occur 1/4 mile south. The workings are collared in alluvium, therefore, no structure is apparent, however, rocks on the dumps were composed of silicious sediments and metasediments (mudstone, shale, phyllite, minor schist). Abundant sericite. Workings probably following highly fractured, almost brecciated quartz veins, heavily FeMn stained, gossany, boxworks, indications of sulfides at depth, none observed on surface. Remains of old building, recently cleaned up. Workings appear be along the thrust contact between the Permian Diablo formation overlying the Ordovician Palmetto Formtion
