DEVELOPMENT: One incline adjacent to a small mill and adit with what looks to have been some production.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None...The drilling activity does not appear to extend to these properties or to those further to the west.

GEOLOGY: Adit bearing N70°W is on a structure in andesite adjacent to shaft and mill on the same structure. These working are just north of a small but abandoned camp of houses and similar living quarters which is adjacent to a spring and just east of the Arrassta site. The drilling and road building crews appear to have used several of the structures for temporary living quarters. Mining activity circles a knob of rhyolite that has on its northern flanks the Cimarron Mine.. the Cimarron Fraction #1 on the northwest side and other unidentified prospects to the west and southside of the knob. From this vantage point the rhyolite maybe a plug that has intruded older andesite that would account for the reported "veins along a contact between rhyolite and andesite". Sample 3161 was from the dumps associated with the shaft and the adit both collared in andesite.
