DEVELOPMENT: Sixteen or more shafts most shallow, numerous prospects and some buildings that are still usable

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: Mine workings are along N-E trending quartz veins that dip 50-70 degrees. The veins are steeply dipping Triassic/Jurassic slates and shists. Several deep shafts explored the veins along the western side of the mountains, but most of the veins were not productive.

Placer titanium was mined southwest of the mountain with limited success. Sample 2803 was taken from dumps in the vicinity of the North Star shaft. The big shaft was sunk on N30°E trending vein dipping 5°W, which is close to the strike and dip of the veins.
