The Little Flower claim, owned by Harold Dunham, is north of Siegle Creek on the east side of the Shell Creek Range, approximately in sec. 34, T. 22 N., R. 65 E. Scheelite occurs with exidized silver, lead, and manganese minerals in a fault between quartiste and limestone. The fault dips 30° E., is mineral ised for a width of 6 feet, and is exposed for a length of 100 feet. The scheelite is irregularly distributed, and part of the ore could be mined and sorted to contain 3 percent of WO3. In 1945-46, Dunham mined and concentrated ore that yielded about 170 units of WO5.
