## SCHEELITE GROUP Pershing County, Nevada

The Scheelite grouph of 5 lode claims is on the west flank of the Seven Troughs, Range, Pershing County, Nevada, 2 miles west of Vernon. The claims were located in the summer of 1943 by Carl E. Thompson of Winnemucca and E. W. Dingee of Lovelock and were leased in August 1943 to Joseph DeMai and Newton Harlan of Renc. The property was idle on June 18, 1944, when I visited it.

Scheelite occurs in a 12-inch pegmatite dike in diorite. The dike is explored by a 25-foot trench, which is the only development on the property. The best ore, exposed in the trench, contains only scattered crystals of scheelite. There is little possibility that any commercial ore can be developed.
