lead.

DEVELOPMENT: Workings consist of an inclined shaft 100 ft deep with about 400 ft of
workings on two levels, a short adit, and several prospects and trenches.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: The workings follow a 4-6 foot vein in a shear bearing N5°W and dipping
erratically. The gossan like mineralization extends into the limestone
and is highly oxidized. The iron-manganese gossan contorts the limestone
causing both bleaching and brecciation. The ore is reported to be and looks
like an oxidized sideritic ferromanganese mixture with silver occurring
along with the lead. There has been no work at the site for many years.
