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Scheelite is found in a quartz vein in granite on claims located during World War I by B. P. Pasch, and re-located by Pasch in 1942. The vein is near the mouth of the first canyon north of Bloody Run Peak in the southern Santa Rosa Mountains. Scheelite is irregularly distributed in the quartz vein, which strikes N. 10° W., dips 43° NE., and averages 3 feet in width. From a lens of high-grade ore found in an inclined shaft 40 feet deep, Mr. Pasch shipped 26 tons of ore containing 270 units of WO₃ to Metals Reserve Co.
