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Schoolite is found in a quarts vein in granite on claims

located during World War I by B. F. Pasch, and re-located by Fasch in 1942. The wein is near the mouth of the first canyon north of Bloody Run Peak in the southern Santa Rosa Mountains. Schoolite is irregularly distributed in the querts vein, which strikes E. 100 H., dips 430 NR., and a verages 8 feet in width. From a lens of highgrade ore found in an inclined shaft 40 feet deep, Mr. Pasch shipped 26 tons of ore containing 270 units of WOg to Metals Reserve Co.
