DEVELOPMENT: Five tunnels or adits lots of trenching and prospecting.ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: According to Wilden R., 1964 the property is underlain by hornfels shale, and schist of the Raspberry Formation of Trisassic age and has been cut by a large steeply dipping granodiorite dike. Pyrite and other sulfides are disseminated through the sediments and all rock types are cut by quartz seams and veins from a fraction of an inch to several feet in width. The large veins contain gold, silver, pyrite and chalcopryite while the narrower seams carry tungsten. Tungsten was lamped from quartz vein material, sample 2384. Parts of the mill are still standing but nothing has operated for many years.
