PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

OF

THE CLARK, NEWTON & ZIEGLER PROPERTY

AT

SILVER BOW, NEVADA

APRIL 29TH, 1916

This property was hurriedly examined on April 29th, 1916.

It has only recently been re-located and consists of four claims, the Mammoth No. 1, Mammoth No. 2, Mammoth No. 3, and Mammoth No. 4. Very little work has been done either by the present or former owners on the ground. These claims are located about one-half mile above the town of Silver Bow.

The work that caused me to make the trip consisted of a shallow pit (5 x 10 x 2 ft. deep) on the top of a silicified band in the rhyolite, from which Mr. Clark claimed very high assays.

The second sampled contained the largest amount of quartz and included the same streak sampled by the owner.

The formation and occurrence of values is very similar to the formation at the Clifford and at the Catlin Mine.

On account of the small amount of work done, it is not advisable to further consider the property. The owners frankly state that they are only in the prospecting stage.
