DEVELOPMENT: Large shaft that was apparently glory-holed or stoped to the surface

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: Large shaft on eastend of a vein that is part of a number of workings including 5-6 inclines and open-stopess along a N75°W, 70°N quartz vein that outcrops along the strike for 3-4 hundred yards. Sample 2779 was collected from the associated dumps. Sample 2780 was from what appears to be an intersecting vein bearing N40W, 70°N..6-8 feet wide in a shear zone with quartz stringers from a few inches to 18 inches in width. Second fault vein system extends for more than a quarter of a mile to the west and is explored inclines, open stopes and prospects many of which appear to be interconnected at depth. The workings are old not on the map nor in the data base. They clearly produced something and may have made use of the mill at the mouth of the canyon. The area does not have usable roads but apparently accounts for the many building sites to the north. Sample 2780 chipped from vein in the shear, from open-stopess and selected from dumps. Only the matrix of some of the minor breccia products showed any visable sulfides and minor pyrite.
