In sending you this brief report I am siming to send you data that will be helpful for future reference. The first work in opening the mine the last time was started on M y 8, 1909, and the work was carried out, as follows:

We were engaged in mining operations 183 days of six months and 5 days. During that time were run tunnels to the amount 787 in length, which cost \$6,950. in labor at \$4.00 per day, - \$9.06 per ft. for the labor of mining, mucking and timbering, which equals 127.81 per month.

Of this work 315° was in the hard solid ore and 458° was in rhyolite and porphyry.

225° and also some later on the 300°.

There has not been any ore taken out for mining between the 225 and the 300 levels. It is all opened up and 2 ore chutes put in on the 300 level for loading, ready to begin stoping for actual mining, leaving thousands of tons of ore practically in sight and a chance of opening up even bigger and better prospects. I have great faith in the mine and feel confident it can be made a good dividend payer.
