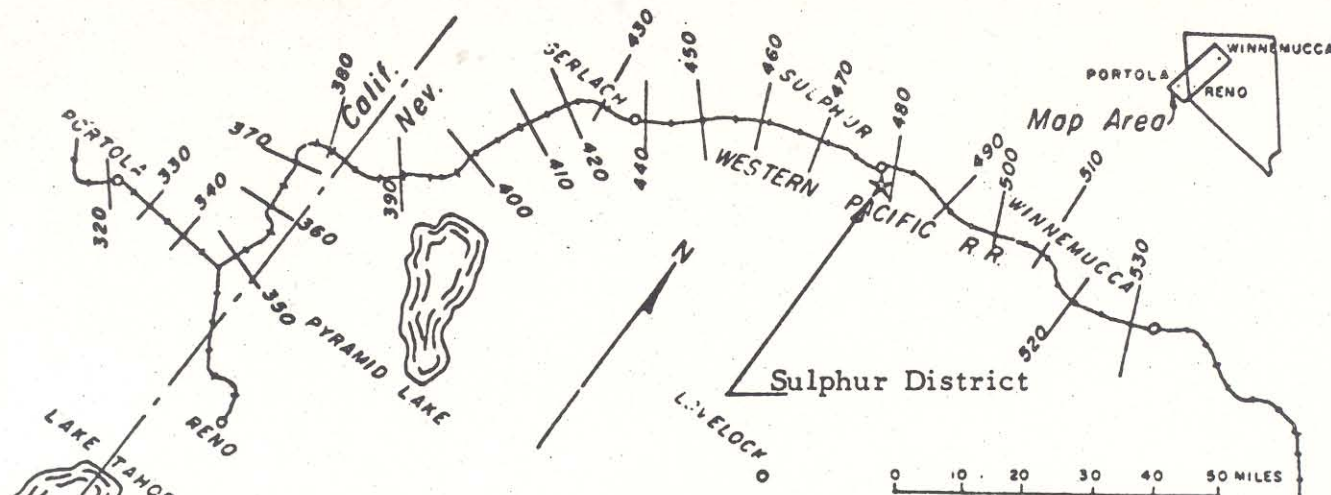

The principal property in the early days was the Silver Camel mine, production said to have been over \$100,000.00 in high-grade silver ore from 1908-1912 principally by lessees.
