ETNA Sulphur Mane

Near Table Mountain; on a hill 10 or 12 miles north of the Humble Sort Marsh, and on the east side of the Table Mtn. Range. Discovered by McAlister and Elliot who located four quarter sections of the mound in which it is situated, and which appears to b principally sulphur. There is a depression in the center of the mound which looks like the crater of an extinct volcano, and from which gases, emitting a stong sulphurous odor, were escaping. Ther greater part of the surface was reported to be covered with sulphur to a depth of at least 2 feet. It was believed that it could be hauled up Pleasant and Grass Valleys to the railroad for \$12 per ton. MSP/ 2/26/76

Steamboat Springs: More sulphur discoveries are being made westward of Steamboat Springs. They have now found a very rich deposit that is traceable for over a mile.
