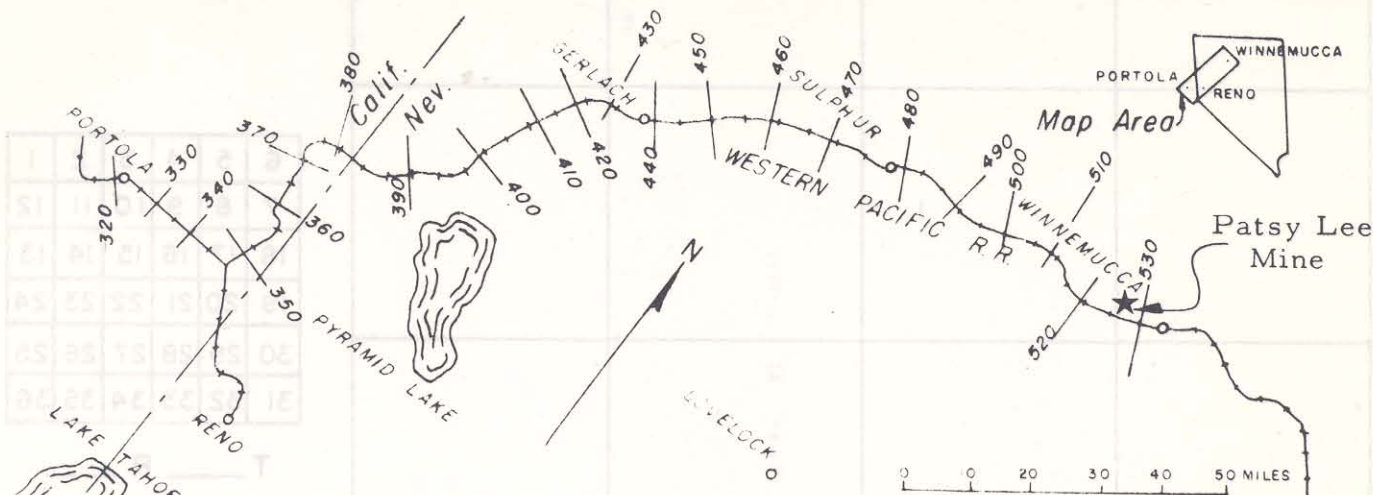

Ownership: (Cont.) Nevada Consolidated Mining Company. This ground was owned (1937) by L. E. Case and Erling Prout of Winnemucca, Nevada.

In 1937 the property was under bond and lease to H. A. Hart and Edward C.

Vren, who were developing the property with a crew of four men. In former years this property is said to have produced \$60,000.00 in shipping ore.

Development comprises several adits, a shaft 180 feet deep and other workings totaling about 1,600 feet.
