True American - TOBIN & SONOMA RANGE MINING AREA

The True American property is in sec. 34, T. 30 N., R. 40 E. at an elevation of 7,000 feet on the east side of the Tobin Range, about 3.5 miles west of Buffalo Springs, Sonoma Range quadrangle. The ore deposit is on a steep slope 800 feet vertically above the end of the road. A small tonnage of sorted ore was shipped to the Metals Reserve stockpile at Battle Mountain in 1942-44 by John B. Blossom and his son.

Schoolite is found in 4 thin, short leases of silicified limestone out by many mineralized quarts stringers, in metamorphosed
shale. The leases dip 25° E., range in width from 1 to 25 inches,
and have a maximum length of 50 feet. Most of the a cheelite occurs
in quarts. Two of the leases were exhausted after yielding 1 and 6
tons ref sorted one respectively. In 1943, it was estimated that the
other 2 might still yield 100 tons of sorted one containing 2.5 pereent of WOg.
