Tokop (Bonnie Claire, Oriental Wash) Mining District, which is about 12 miles South and East of Goldpoint, Esmeralda County, Nevada.

Mr. ~~Marcy~~ Reports:

Work stopped on the Marcy Mine when World War II broke out. They left a lot of good ore in the dump. The ore shows mostly silver values with assays from \$40. to \$100., some showing an ounce of gold. His letter shows a rough map of the area and claims and where the assays were taken.

Price:

Price for the 5 claims is \$10,000.00.

Report: Previously under date of July 13, 1970, Mr. Nihart submitted a report of 14 unpatented claims in this area for a price of \$28,000. with a substantial down payment with monthly payments and a 5% royalty.

The latter part of August, Mr. Nihart called the office in regards to his property and he was anxious that some one inspect the same. He will grant permission to inspect and sample the property.

History:

This area has produced some high grade gold and silver, however, in some of the mines it comes in pockets and stringers.

Sir:

In answer to our phone call of July 20, 1970, I am sending you further information. These claims are near Goldpoint, Nevada, sometimes called Hornsilver or Lime Point on the map. It is near Goldfield, Nevada, south of Tonapah.

There is probably 1500 acres of good mineral land available in this area. All of it is open government land outside of 28 claims. I have 14 claims in this area. I would like to sell them for around \$28,000. The other 14 claims I did own, but a friend of mine has been making payments to me on them and he wants to sell them. They are the Old Frenchie Mines which were good producers. Fifty feet is as deep as anyone has dug. This land has never been drilled.

I believe this is one of the richest potential silver areas in Nevada- with plenty of gold mixed with it. It looks to me like an ideal open pit project. I have taken many assays from the surface that runs \$37.00 to \$100. per ton and much of it with 1 ounce of gold in it. I do not have the capital to operate these mines. I will sell these with a substantial down and monthly payments. I would like a 5% royalty when in operation.

I would be willing to give you an option and ^{to} you go ahead and drill and test the land.

The enclosed assays are from four main claims. ~~I could make arrangements to show you this land after the 20th of July as I will be in Goldpoint doing government work.~~

Mining in this area started in 1900 and shut down when World War II started.
