

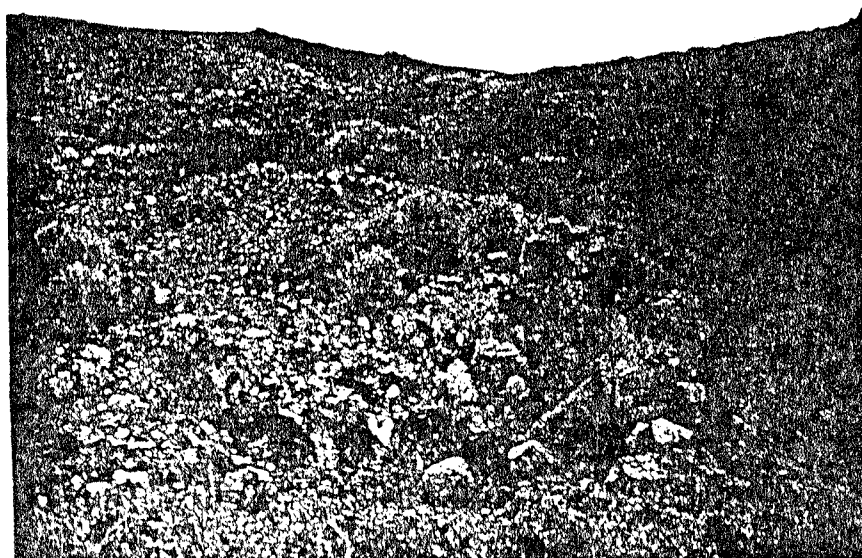

The site of the Black Mountain ruins is in the San Antonio Mountains. The gently sloping terrain is dotted with sagebrush. The ruins consist of some mine diggings, mortared rubble-rock walls that have almost entirely collapsed,



and a considerable amount of debris -- bottles, cans, bedsprings, corrugated metal, pieces of wood. On the southeast exposure of a small mountain near the ruins is a mine. The mortared walls, approximately 3 feet high, once encompassed a 10' x 8' structure. There is also an excavation for a structure that was approximately 7 feet square. On the side of the hill is a low retaining wall.
