REPORT on GOLDEN GLOW MINE.

LOCATION.

This property is located about 5 miles North-east of the Town of Tanonah County of Nye State of Nevada.

HOLDINGS.

The property consists of 6 Lede Mining Claims held by the right of location.

GEOLOGY.

Three flows or intrusions of rocks have occured in this area. First occurs an Andesite which was later covered by a Rhyolite flow and this in turn was covered by a Basalt flow.

In a small wash in this area the Basalt and Rhyolite have been croded away and a Brecciated Quartz Vein has been exposed in the Andesite. This Vein has been uncovered for a length of about 12 ft. and is covered on both sides of wash with hyolite. This vein originally carried Iron Pyrite which has been exidized and leached. The vein as exposed carries Gold and Silver values.

DEVELOPMENT.

.A hele about 20 ft.deep was dug on the property about 10 years ago, but being in the wash has been filled in to a depth of about 8 ft. This shows the vein to have a width of about 5 ft. and is strong and well defined.

ORE VALUES AND TONNAGE.

The property being in the prospective stage has no ere in sight and all possibilities lie in future development.

While the values as shown are to low to be commercial as a whole, dusto the small amount of exposure the indications are good.

EQUIPMENT.

There is no equipment on the property.

OPERATING CONDITIONS.

OPERATING CONDITIONS. (cont.)

Theold Tenepah Springs from which water was pumped to Tenepah are withinh & mile of the property.

Being close to Tenopah good Miners can be readily secured.

The road to Tonopah can easily be put in good shape for trucking and Tonopah would be the point from which most of thesupplies would be obtained.

CONCLUSIONS.

This property lies within the zone of what has been a highly mineralized and productive District.

Considering the short length of vein exposure and small amount of work that has been done on the property the values as shown are very good and the property warrants further development.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

I recommend that this property be further developed by means of a shaft and drifting along the vein. This shaft should be sunk to a depth of 40 or 50 ft. and 50 to 100 ft. of drifting be done on the vein.
