Molly Group

The Molly group of claims lies south of the Buckeye and Rescue-Eula mines. A shaft was sunk on the property in 1903 to a depth of 468 feet, and cut, according to Spurr<sup>1/</sup>, rhyolite in the upper two-thirds and

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Fraction breccia in the lower third, with 25 feet of andesite at the bottom.

There has apparently been no additional work on the shaft since that time.

In 1925 the Red Hill Florence Company of Goldfield leased the ground and extended the 1400-foot level of the Buckeye into Molly territory. No ore was found, however, and the work was abandoned in 1927.
