THE MAYFLOWER AND BIMETALLIC GROUPS

NORTH FORK OF TWIN RIVER - NYE COUNTY - NEVADA

The Mayflower and Bimetallic groups are located near the mouth of the North Fork of the Twin River, about 21 miles from Round Mountain, Nevada. The nearest railroad point is Millers, 65 miles to the south.

The country is rugged, but the location is such that haulage difficulties are not great. Water flows across the Mayflower claims but it is probable that the rights of certain ranchers would have to be purchased in order to use any of it. Power could be brought in by a 12 mile extension of the Nevada-California Power Co.'s line to Round Mountain.

GEOLOGY - DEVELOPMENT

There are four nearly parallel veins on the groups. These veins strike north west, dip about 75° N and can be traced for several thousand feet. In places there is up to 10 ft. of quartz and silicified country rock containing a little disseminated galena, but the average width is much less than this. At some points the wall rock is a diorite, at others an igneous rock too altered and silicified to determine. Four basalt dikes cut both the country rock and the veins.

The small amount of work done has failed to open up ore of a commercial grade. Only location work has been done on the

Bimetallic claims. On the Mayflower there is an open cut and a 35 ft. tunnel. The following samples were taken at these two points:- Mayflower Tunnel 1.2 ft. on NW 5.6 oz. Silver
 10 ft. from face
 Open Cut, 100 ft. 3.6 ft. on NW 10.2 oz. Silver.
 above tunnel

Both of these samples showed a little galena, but not over 1% lead.

The only operating property in the district adjoins the Mayflower claims on the east and North. Here 600 ft. of work have been failed to prove the existance of a body of ore.

OWNERSHIP, TERMS.

The Mayflower group of two claims is owned by Frank Stefanac, Fred Greenvald, T.M. Abraham and Obi Lefivor. The price asked is \$60,000.00, \$6,000.00 cash, the balance in one year.

The Bimetallic group of six claims is owned by Frank Stefanac, W.A. Johnson, Frank Kelley and Fred McBicson. Price is \$50,000.00, in one year, but no cash payment.

The property was brought to the attention of the Company by Frank Stefanac as agent for the owners.

CONCLUSIONS

Showings on the property and in the district do not warrant the Company taking an option on the properties.

The prices asked are out of proportion to the present values of these claims.


