DEVELOPMENT: Deep vertical shaft (very old) connecting adit (caved) upper adits and connecting stopes on N. side of canyon, stopes and adits on south side, aerial tram from south to north.

ACTIVITY AT TIME OF EXAMINATION: None

GEOLOGY: Old workings on N. side of canyon on N40°E, 80°NW shear zone is phyllite white vein quartz with clots sphalerite, MnO staining, seen on dump.

Workings on south side of the canyon are in buff marble lenses contained in sediment section. Vein quartz from piles at foot of tram line contain large scheelite crystals. Kleinhample mentions New Moose tungsten claim east of Buckeye, this was not seen, but scheelite could be from there - structure described as being the same as the Buckeye, but to the east(?).
