Valley View district covers part of the eastern slope of the Ruby Range north of Harrison Pass. The district is almost entirely within the Humboldt National Forest.

Mineral deposits in the district are associated with pegmatites which cut older granitic intrusives and schists. Some tungsten ore has been shipped from the district, and there has been exploration for mica and beryl.

There has been no activity in the district for some time, and none was noted at the time of this visit.
