Memo: Hamilton, visit of October 8,9,10, 1979.

Drilling:

No new drilling was seen in the vicinity of the Imperial Mine workings.

There was a new drill hole on the Madison. This hole is near proposed DH-6and about 120' to the southeast. The cuttings from this hole had been sampled. The hole was marked SF 79-1 on pieces of scrap heavy paper or cardboard. The cuttings, for each 5' interval, were neatly piled in rows. The cuttings from 385' to 390' was mineralized. These cuttings were split and the resulting sample sent for assay, as were the two sample intervals on either side.

Were on the hill top between proposed holes DH-9, DH-10, and H-6. None of these four holes nor their cuttings were marked. These four holes were drilled within a ± 200' diameter circular area. There was no abvious mineralization to be seen in the cuttings from these four holes; however the holes had apparently cut quartzite bedding, near the bottom. Only two of the holes had been sampled.

None of the buttings from these drill holes were logged by me at this time. Hole SF 79-1 was only partially re-sampled. The others were not re-sampled at all. It is expected to finish the re-sampling on my next visit to the property.

By logging the cuttings from these holes and making drill cutting boards a start will be made in detailing the stratt tigrafy and its accompanying mineralization.
