LOCATION:

The above properties are located about ten miles northeasterly from the town of Lovelock, Nevada. The camp of Rochester lies about three miles to the east. The Southern Pacific Railroad comes to within three miles of the property and the nearest sidetrack is Kodak, about four miles distant. The camp is now known as the Loring District. Wagon roads can be easily constructed between property and railroad without excessive grades.

PROPERTY:

Both companies and the Shepherd's Dream Lease are controlled by E. E. Roberts and W. I. Beauchamp, of Reno, Nevada. The lease was purchased from Jose and Davis and there is still \$25,000. coming to them out of a \$30,000. purchase. Although it was not verified, it is understood that Jose and Davis have charge of the mining operations on the lease until they are paid in full.

The Willard Metals Mines Company includes the following locations:

Memory 1, Memory 2, Memory 3, Memory 6, Memory 7, Memory 8, Memory 9 and Memory 10.

With these it is understood that the Rose Quartz, Apex 1, Apex 2 and Ruby Claims would be thrown in.

The New Willard Gold Mines Company includes the following locations:

Memory 4, Memory 5, Black Cloud and Black Cloud Fraction.

The Jose-Davis Group includes seven locations lying to the east and south of the Shepherd's Dream Group.

The Shepherd's Dream Group includes the Shepherd's Dream, Bankers Dream and the Prospector's Dream.

Besides the above locations, application to purchase has been made to the Southern Pacific Railway Company for the W. 1/2 of N.W. 1/4, the W. 1/2 of N.W. 1/4 of N.E. 1/4 and the

N.W. 1/4 of S.W. 1/4, Sec. 25, T. 28 N., R. 32 E. The selections of railroad land are to cover conflicts with the above mentioned groups, except the Sheepherder's Dream Lease.

None of the various claims are patented.

The lease on the Sheepherder's Dream also includes the Banker's Dream and the Prospector's Dream, and has a year and five months to run. The royalties are 7-1/2% of smelter returns up to February, 1920, and after that date the royalties are 15%.

DEVELOPMENT:

Very little or none on any group except the Sheepherder's Dream, a plat of which is shown with this report.

ORES:

Quartz and calcite vein croppings show on Apex 1, Rose Quartz and Memory 3 of the Willard Metals Mines Company, but no exploration work to determine their value.

Quartz and calcite vein croppings have been slightly prospected on the Black Cloud and Black Cloud Fraction of the New Willard Gold Mines Company, but samples No. 1 and No. 2 failed to show any appreciable value in gold or silver. These two groups are frankly admitted to be for acreage purposes primarily. The New Willard Gold Mines Company acreage would be materially benefited by the addition of Sunset 1, Sunset 2, Snowstorm and Snowstorm 1 if prospecting of the outcrops at depth were undertaken on the Black Cloud Fraction.

A lesser system of quartz and calcite vein material shows on the Jesse-Davis Group, with no development work of any kind.

The vein in the Sheepherder's Dream extends from near the southwest end line of the claim in a northeasterly direction for about 400 feet. There has been a small amount of surface prospecting done on the outcrop and some very fine gold specimens have been obtained.

The principal development work has been confined to a tunnel which has connected with two shallow shafts, the total depth below the surface nowhere being over 40 feet, and the distance developed along the vein by the tunnel being 85 feet.

The attached sketch of the tunnel shows position of the vein as exposed and the location of the samples. The highest return in gold from eight samples was 0.18 of an ounce. The samples were all from vein material indicated by Mr. Beauchamp, and go to show that outside of the spots of residual gold, the vein matter has no commercial value. All the veins examined occur in fissures in shale. Intrusions of rhyolite occur in the southeasterly portion of the district.

GENERAL:

No equipment, camp housings or improvements exist on any

of the Groups. Water has to be hauled four miles from the Humboldt River. While the Lahontan Power Line passes near the properties, it is doubtful whether they have any excess over the requirements at Rochester. Terms were not discussed.

CONCLUSION:

On account of the spotted character of the Sheepherder's Dream vein, and the apparent absence of values in the outcrop on the other groups, these properties cannot be recommended for further development.

THE HONEY HIVE GROUP.

Located southeasterly from the properties under consideration, and containing practically the same type of vein in fissured shale.

At present considerable exploration of the outcrop of the Finlander vein is being done. Sinking of the Malley shaft is in progress, and shows an unaltered shale as depth increases. The surface shales show effects of weathering and oxidization.

The main vein under development is no more impressive than the Sheepherder's Dream vein. The equipment is small and of the gas engine type.
