

In compliance with instructions received from the U. S. Surveyor General for Nevada, dated September 7, 1920,

I establish U.S. Mineral Monument No. 304, as follows:-

Set a lime rock 2x2.5 ft., 3 ft. long, 1.5 ft. in the ground, chiseled with a x and U S M M No. 304 (and raise mound of rock 6 ft. wide at base and 4 ft. high; alongside)

Whence

The West $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of section 7, T. 4 N., R. 56 E. M.D.B. and M. bears N.89°12'25"W. 11,611.00 ft.

Cor. No. 1 New Year Ex Lode bears S. 85°09'40"E. 1326.15 ft.

Cor. Nos. 1 and 3, Sur. No. 4465 New Year Mine and New Year No. 1 lodes bears N.82°46'W. 174.00 ft.

A pinon pine tree 8 ins. in diam. blazed and scribed B T U S M M No 304 bears S 40°E. 8.3 ft.

A rock monument on the summit of Willow Creek Mountain bears S. 15° 00'E.

The summit of a timbered mountain bears S.57°0'E.


The well at Nyala Post Office in Railroad Valley bears N. 45° 38'W.

This monument is situated on a ridge extending N.45° W. and S. 45°E.; well protected from destruction by natural causes and is visible for a long distance from all directions.

Latitude is about 38° 12'30"N.

Longitude is about 115° 41' W.

Nyala Post Office is situated about two miles to the Northwest, being the **nearest** permanent habitation.
