Location: Claims are located about 3 miles Easterly from
Nyala in Railroad Valley about 90 miles from
Tonopah, Nevada all in Nye County.

History: Mrs. Fishel inherited the property from her father
in 1956. She has done nothing with it. She is
not sure about the title or what the status of the
property is.

Report: They were unpatented mining ~~claims~~ and according to the
County recorder, the last proof of labor that was
filed was in June 20, 1955. From a preliminary
survey at the court house, the claims are delinquent.
It is not known if they were taken up by other
parties under a different name or not. ONLY a field
trip will reveal this information.

Note: The sale of this rproperty to Hughes Tool Comapny
was encourage by Paula Clark (Dean Elson's secretary)
and a Mr. Ellis of Hughes Nevada Operations. To
satisfy all parties concerned it would be well to
notify Mrs. Vivian Fishel that apparently there
was no annual assessment work done on the claims and
seemingly they returned to the public domain and only
a field trip would ~~determine~~ if they were open to
file on again.
(The field trip could be made as soon as the weather
permitted.)

There are no Hughes Tool Company claims in this area
and three isolated claims, even if the title was valid
would be of little value at the present.time.
