

DESCRIPTION: Discovered 1863 by an Indian named Winnemucca. A 10-stamp mill erected in 1872 and a roasting oven at Winnemucca. Some ore assayed over \$400.00/ton. Most production from one mine; Pride of the West (about \$1,000,000.00). Scavenger operations were underway in 1937. Small amounts of lead and silver.

RESERVES: Abandoned after over \$1,000,000.00 production.

ACCESS: Two miles southeast to Winnemucca and Western Pacific Railroad.

Description: (Cont.) in the Spring of 1906, but there was very little activity until 1910, when E. E. Carpenter discovered high-grade gold ore in this area.

In 1911 it was found that the principal claims were on patented railroad land and mining activity came to a standstill until the land was purchased from the railroad (SP).
