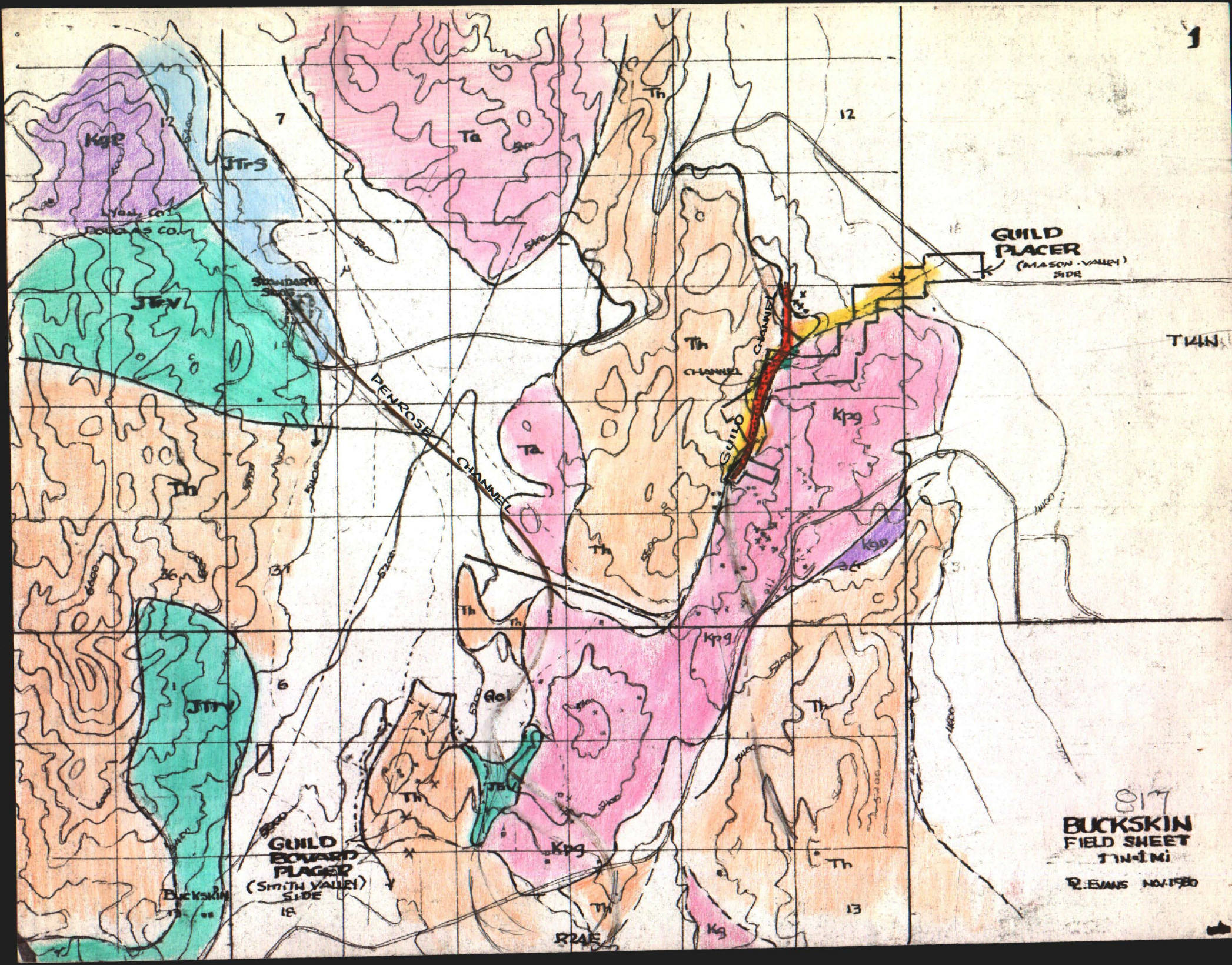

RE-GUILD PLACERS  
RE-SMITH VALLEY PLACERS

Dear Judge:--

I have not contacted you since our telephone conversation, for the reason that I felt that I would wait until I could provide you with dependable information regarding probable investors who would operate the Guild and Smith Valley placer mines. Now I believe that I can confirm this.

As of now, I feel that as an engineer and miner, from the sixteen months I spent on the properties studying the geological factors, gravel types brought in by erosion, segments of old channel where exposed, measurements of depth of overburden and depth of pay gravel, I probably have more factual knowledge of the properties than any living person.

I have endeavored from different sources and records extant to gain some knowledge of the past history of the properties; what exploration and development took place since 1931; what extent the production of Gold was and the methods of recovery.

- 1---The reason of the statement in the above paragraph was for the purpose to make a comparison of results over a period of 28 years with those made by myself in 1960 and 1961.
- 2---The written records which I have studied are those of Bedford, Yorston, samplings made by Nutting et al, (Protso), Bradley. A summation of this sampling by each party would be enough to discourage investors to go further in an attempt to establish a profitable operation on the Guild placers, at the present cost factor. It is evident that Bedford and Bradley samplings were made in the old Adams-Rice shafts. The Protso sampling by Keystone drilling I will consider valueless and unfair to the property. Wet drilling whereby a sludge is pumped to the surface, a percentage of the Gold remains on bedrock or on the false bedrock and is impossible to calculate in samples obtained by this method. The Yorston sampling by the high tenor of his results, indicate his samples came from bedrock. Therefore are not indicative of average gravel value. As the Bedford samples came from the old workings, they evidently were taken below the strata of the overburden. His average of \$12.25 per yard would have fallen far below this if the overburden assays had been included in his final figure. Checking the work of the Apex people, who cut a shovel-cut along  
3---the western flank of the gulch for a distance of three quarters of a mile, it is evident their object was solely to pick up the remnants of the old river channel to recover the coarse Gold and nuggets. The overburden was deep and their stacking of same on the eastern flank of the gulch presents a difficulty for future operators by having to remove double the amount of overburden to get into the paybed. Also observation of the washed tailings at their plant confirms the opinion that only channel Gold was sought as the amount is small compared to the great amount of piled gravel removed by shovel.



3---From what I am able to learn and by study,--during the Tertiary Age a sizeable river flowed northerly and southerly over the site of the present placer lands. The time scale of this live river dates back to approximately thirty million years ago. In the Pleistocene Period, its duration estimated to be ten million years, the uplift of the rock structure formed the present Singatse mountain range. Folding, faulting and other mountain building forces completely destroyed the course of the river. Over millions of years the already destroyed channel of the river was covered by eroded material from the higher elevations. I have traversed the canyon from the alluvial fan at the edge of Mason Valley its full length and on up to the summit of the Singatse Range. In the canyon itself and high up on the slopes on both the east and west slopes, I have found the rounded pebbles of river gravel. The uplift of the range during the Pleistocene Period scattered the river bed over considerable territory, as the rounded pebbles are found in the side gulches considerable distance from the main canyon. I am quoting the above to establish the fact, that a major mining operation whose purpose is to recover channel Gold would be confined to drifting on bedrock to pick up the scattered segments of the ancient channel. The breaks in continuity of these segments could not be of attractive scope, as the uncertainty of the occurrences over any distances. Wherever possible, I descended the old shafts and found when bedrock was reached, that considerable drift mining had taken place. The paybed is so cemented and compacted that use of explosives is necessary to breakup the gravel.

4---The country rock sloping down into the canyon is composed chiefly of a heavily oxidized Quartz-Porphyry. Both visible to the naked eye and the microscope I found that this formation is host to paper thin veinlets of Quartz. By examination of many of these veinlets, I find under the microscope that fine free Gold is contained therein. The ages of erosion of the slopes of country rock and from the side gulches has disseminated this Gold at lower horizons, principally in the main canyon. A mixture of clay seems to have cemented the gravel from bedrock up to an average height of six to twelve feet. Above this lays the overburden, very sparse in Gold content. This overburden forms a mantle laying on the paybed to a depth of six feet up to 40 feet.

5---The paramount consideration we must give, is the economic value of the gravel; the Gold content per yard which must average above recovery costs substantially. Therefore, we must ~~make base calculations~~ <sup>base calculations</sup> the concentrations of the NEW GOLD eroded from the Porphyry and present in the cemented paybed extending from the head of the canyon down into the alluvial fan. As stated in Paragraph No.3, we can place no dependence upon the continuity of the channel Gold in place. In the overall operation a CONSTANT of values in Gold must be established if possible. This possibly lays in the strata of the paybed, a concentration of NEW GOLD. The inclusion of channel Gold when encountered will be an additive in raising the value of Gold content per yard, but cannot be called a CONSTANT.

6---In reviewing the records on hand of estimated yardage in the canyon and alluvial fan and comparing them with my own estimates, there is a wide disparity in the figures. We have very carefully made measurements across the canyon from wall to wall to include every area therein which covers pay strata. Every shaft which could be inspected from grassroots to bottom was measured to find depth of overburden and the thickness of pay gravel; every drill hole we made underwent the same system of measurement; every dragline cut was measured the same way; wherever we were able to cut down with bulldozer we followed this same practice to determine without question what gravel could be mined and what yardage of waste gravel would have to be removed before production could be made through a recovery plant.

The upper part of the canyon is narrow. Nugget Claims No. 2 and No. 3 cover the narrows. Here we were able to get down two drill holes, both 12 feet deep. The overburden was seven feet, below this to a depth of 5 feet lay the paybed, the same compacted cemented gravel, which gave us an average of \$2.65 Gold value per yard. About the center of Nugget No. 2, we made a bulldozer cut at an angle across the canyon. Owing to narrowness of the canyon the waste could not be stacked on the slopes. The overburden was eight feet deep. In cutting into the paybed, the blade broke into the roof of an old drift. This we entered and found the cemented pay gravel to be a strata five feet thick. This sampled \$3.44 Gold per yard. The overburden from the above three points, by panning showed only sparse flour Gold. Estimate same about 15¢ per yard.

From the records of previous measurements made for yardage contained in Nugget No. 2 and Nugget No. 3, I find that canyon width is set at 100 feet. This figure is not accurate. My figure is 50 feet. The canyon walls have a steep pitch to the level terrain of the canyon, and if a width of 100 feet was accepted the sides of the gravel strata would be considerable distance up the slopes, far above the paybed. Accepting this width of 50 feet as continuing down the canyon for a distance of approximately 1600 feet and a pay gravel depth of 5 feet, the following should give us the following estimate of yardage.

50 X 5 X 1600-----400,000 Cubic Feet

YARDS-----14,814-plus.

Calculating that the overburden lays seven feet deep on the above paybed on Nugget No. 2 and No. 3, about 20,000 yards of waste would have to be removed before the valuable gravel could be washed. Therefore, considering the minor amount of pay yardage and the larger amount of overburden to be removed, it would not pay to consider this gravel to be of economic value to any large operation. But this ground could be leased for wholly underground bedrock operation by an individual or small group of people.

As we go further north in the canyon, to the north end of Nugget No. 3 and the length of Nugget No. 4 we find a widening of the canyon and an increase in the spread of the gravel. Also there is a greater depth to the overburden. On Nugget No. 4, we put down four drill holes. Their depth averaged 18 feet. Vertical measurements gave us 13 feet of overburden and 5 feet of pay grave. Assays of pay were--\$1.86--4.11--2.20--2.90.

At the north end of Nugget No. 3, we made a bulldozer cut east and west, from the slope of the rock formation to the opposite slope. The pitch was gradual from both sides. We cut to a depth of 22 feet. It was a disappointment to find that the paybed was only three feet deep, whose Gold content consisted wholly of flour Gold, running not over \$1000 per yard. From our drill holes and the bulldozer cut, the possible paybed is not over 100 feet in width. In the center of Nugget No. 4, we made a bulldozer cut north and south for a distance of 100 feet, here the overburden is 16 feet deep and the paybed 6 feet deep. In washing the gravel from paybed, we found only flour Gold and one wheat size nugget. Values---\$1.33 per yard.

The northerly area of Nugget No. 4 was shovel cut by the Apex people. Here we find a great depth of overburden up to 25 feet deep. Again we enter a narrows, with waste material piled on the sides preventing sampling unless a bulldozer removed these waste piles and the bottom of the shovel cut was cleaned to the paybed, which is not exposed for over 1000 feet.

The southerly area of Nugget No. 5 widens to 200 feet. To define the west slope we bulldozed north and south for a distance of 150 feet down to the rock formation. (Quartz-porphry) When the sloping floor was determined, we made a bulldozer cut east and west for 100 feet, at this distance we encountered the east slope. This east-west cut was made through fifteen feet of waste to the top of the paybed. This was so cemented that the blade would not cut through same. Setting up an air compressor we drilled down to bed rock through a cemented strata 6 feet thick, we blasted out over an area of 6 x 6, which broke into an old drift leading from a caved shaft. Our sampling here was the most satisfactory of any yet made. From bedrock up four feet, the average was \$5.10 Gold per yard. The two feet above this, gave us \$3.74 Gold per yard. The overburden from this area yielded only 53¢ Gold per yard.

As we traverse north on Nugget No. 4, we enter another narrows. Here the Apex company made their longest and deepest shovel, piling the waste to the east to such an extent that it must be removed before any ground to the east can be sampled. They worked along the west slope for production.

At the widening of canyon at the south end of Nugget No. 5, we put down eight drill holes as recorded in log enclosed. Here the cemented gravel of the paybed was impenetrable to our drill to a depth of not over 2 feet. In this locale we set up our wet sampler, all black sand and flour Gold was panned down to a concentrate. We found that a large percentage of the flour Gold was not amenable to amalgamation, its coating of iron oxide prevented full contact with the mercury. As there were no nuggets found in the concentrates our samples for assay included both black sand and Gold together. As our penetration was only two feet into the paybed, we cannot estimate as of now the true depth to bedrock and the thickness of pay. But estimating the depth of overburden we know it to average from 9 feet to 40 feet in the area of the eight drill holes.

When there was a possibility that the Dricon system would recover Gold, it was expedient that a source of pay gravel should be made available. In September 1960, after Gibson designated the locale of his dry plant, we immediately endeavored to open pay gravel close to the plant.

Setting up the drill near the eastern slope near the center of Nugget No. 5, we drilled to a depth of 46 feet through overburden to the underlying formation. Moving westerly, as we found no pay gravel in the first hole we put down hole No. 2 to a depth of 19 feet in waste. The next six feet was in pay, and the flour Gold and black sand gave a value of \$65.10. Moving westerly for fifty feet, hole No. 2 pierced 23 feet of overburden to the paybed. We found the paybed to be 5 feet thick and the composite assay ran 108.50. Fifty feet further to the west, Hole No. 3 went down through 25 feet of waste to the pay gravel. The latter was 6 feet thick and the flour Gold and black sand assayed \$252.70 per yard. Owing to the great banks of alluvial aggregate washed down from the high elevations we could not drill any further to the west. Considering the values found in holes No. 2 and No. 3 and an adjacent hole to No. 3 designated as No. 4, which gave a pay gravel assay of \$193.64, it was decided to push development here to gain production of pay for recovery through the Dricon.

We made a cut by caterpillar from Hole No. 3, northerly for 150 feet. Cutting through the waste to a depth of 17 feet, we found the strata of the pay bed. This was so cemented that the caterpillar blade could not cut down only a few feet. By drilling and blasting and then blading the loose gravel we were able to get down to the slope of the bedrock. The pay strata averaged from four feet to thirteen feet as we cut north. At this time we lost the caterpillar, but by use of the dragline we were able to continue under slower development. We made a dragline cut to the west in an endeavor to cut down to the gutter. The overburden became deeper in this direction. Forty feet westerly from the bulldozer cut we hit the west slope of the formation with two feet of pay gravel. Returning to the bulldozer cut we drifted by blasting down into the gutter. Here we continued the drift north for forty feet. The pay bed averaged here 5 feet thick. But overall in the 150 foot cut will say that we have 12 feet of pay gravel with a waste capping of 18 feet.

As this development progressed, we kept the wet washer in constant use for testing, for Gold and black sand values. Referring to photostat sheet No. 2 you will find results of our tests.

Enclosed you will find photostats of the log of the drill holes on Nugget No. 5 together with assay returns.

We continued drilling north from Hole No. 19, as stated on sheet No. 3. These holes went down on Nugget No. 6--7--8--9--10, into the alluvial fan. We found an average depth of overburden on No. 6 & 7 to be 27 feet. On No. 8 it averaged 33 feet. On No. 9 its thickness was 37 Ft. On No. 10 the thickness was 37 feet. All in all 28 holes were drilled on these claims outside of the 19 logged. We found the strata contained more coarse aggregate and when the pay strata was reached, its compactness and toughness stopped the drill from any penetration. During this drilling we tested the gravel by wet washer consistently. The overburden from the 28 holes was virtually barren, but few fine colors showing. The scrapings from top of paybed when washed would not average over 50¢ Gold, with sparse black sand. Together with this drilling, we endeavored by use of dragline to cut down and into the paybed. This was no better than the drill. We came to the conclusion that development could not be satisfactorily continued without using caterpillar with hydraulic rippers.
